4 Year plan, with all year groups working on the same <u>unit title</u>, but at a depth appropriate to their ability. The 4 key skills foci, based on the Citizenship National Curriculum ensure progression as pupils journey through the school, covering all of the key areas at a level appropriate to their needs, revisiting where needed and ensuring that pupils' gain sticky knowledge that they can build on as they travel on their learning journey through the school. Plan is revised annually, with Post 16 pupils revisiting and consolidating learning in each of the key areas.
