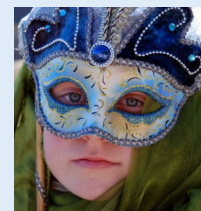

Pâques Easter activities in France begin more than a month before Easter itself. Many cities celebrate **carnival**, when there are street parties, dressing up, parades and lots of fun during a period of two or even three weeks! The tradition of carnival is thought to have originated in the city of **Nice**, in the south of France.



Carnival ends with a huge **party** called **Mardi Gras**. On **Mardi Gras**, everyone eats lots of doughnuts, pancakes and waffles. Doughnuts and pancakes use up all the rich foods such as sugar, butter, eggs and flour, ones that people try not to eat during Lent, which comes next.
